PRINCIPAL REPORT

"Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him." – Matthew 2:2

I have always loved the story of the magi, or wise men. Historically, we know so very little about them. Thought the traditional song about them gives a lot of details, in truth the Bible gives us very little information. We really don't know how many there were, where exactly they came from (other than "the east"), or how long exactly it took for them to reach Bethlehem. What we do know is that, through a sign in the heavens and some exposure to Old Testament prophecies, it was revealed to them that the Messiah was born, and that he was important enough for them to make a journey to see him and present some very precious gifts. Perhaps the reason I've always felt a close connection to their part of the story is the things we have in common with them. They were Gentiles (non-Jews), and so are we. Gentiles were not the chosen people of the promise, yet through Jesus's redeeming work they (and we) are part of the "all nations" to be blessed with the gift of salvation. Our knowledge of the promised Savior like theirs came not from an angelic announcement, but the revelation of God's Word. Through the Holy Spirit, that same Word works on the hearts of God's people to continue to seek him out and be near him today.

Though it does not tell us in the Scriptures, I can imagine that, like the shepherds, the magi did not keep their knowledge to themselves, but continued to share their excitement and joy. Why wouldn't they? As we finish up our Christmas season, put away our decorations, and prepare for a new year, I pray that we may continue to share the joy of our salvation through Jesus with those around us as we continue telling the story of Jesus that started in Bethlehem but ended with an undeserved cross, an empty tomb, and a fulfilled promise to all who believe.

We enjoyed the story retold by our preschool through grade 8 students as they presented the message of our Savior's birth at our school Christmas Service, "A Christmas Prayer" on December 18th. What a great opportunity for our students to do "angels' work" sharing the good news of great joy for all people with our church and school family, as well as other family and friends. Thank you, Zion students and teachers, for sharing your Christmas joy with us!

Beside our Christmas preparations, several other activities occurred this last month. The co-ed basketball teams assembled and began their practices. Coach Kurt Nielsen along with assistants Grace Horn and Hannah Liechty are working with the C (grade 3-4) team. Coach Nielsen is also coaching the B team (grades 5-6), and Mr. Steve Sordahl is coaching grades 7-8. We thank them for their work as they prep our Warriors for the upcoming season. ¹After Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, when Herod was king, Wise Men from the east came to Jerusalem. They asked, ² "Where is he who has been born King of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him." ³ When King Herod heard this, he was alarmed, and all Jerusalem with him. ⁴He gathered together all the people's chief priests and experts in the law. He asked them where the Christ was to be born. ⁵ They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, because this was written through the prophet: ⁶You, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are certainly not least among the rulers of Judah: because out of you will come a ruler, who will shepherd my people, Israel."

Then Herod secretly summoned the Wise Men and found out from them exactly when the star had appeared. ⁸ He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search carefully for the child. When you find him, report to me, so that I may also go and worship him." After listening to the king, they went on their way. Then the star they had seen when it rose went ahead of them, until it stood still over the place where the child was. 10 When they saw the star, they rejoiced with overwhelming joy. ¹¹ After they went into the house and saw the child with Mary, his mother, they bowed down and worshipped him. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts: gold, frankincense, and myrrh. 12 Since they had been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they went back to their own country by another route.


