"Garbage In, Garbage Out" is an old computer programming adage. Basically, it means that the computer program will respond according to what is input. If the information input is corrupted, the information output will be as well.

The same adage applies to ourselves and our children. We wouldn't open our computer's system files and then let our five-year-old pound on the keyboard. Yet how often do we as Christians forget that the world is pounding its anti-Christian message through television, movies, and the internet. Though there are many media sources with positive messages, through television shows, movies, and streaming videos and music we can inadvertently open up our children and ourselves to exposure to behavior in actions and speech that we would not imagine allowing to occur in our home.

Sometimes we even hold ourselves to different standards. Have you ever said to your child, "Go in the other room. You shouldn't watch this show," and then we watch it ourselves? "Garbage in, garbage out." applies to adults as well. Parents, what are you watching?

And these influences can and do affect God's people. That is why Scripture warns against them.

"I don't know where in the word he learned that language, teacher. We don't talk that way at home." Maybe you don't, but your TV does.

"I don't know why she is acting that way. That's not the respect that we teach her at home." But what does her music teach her? Or her streaming video choices?

Too often we make excuses for our entertainment. "That's just the way it is nowadays." But Ephesians 5:8-12 reminds us of our reason to be different: "For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of light (for the fruit of the light consists in all goodness, righteousness and truth) and find out what pleases the Lord. Have nothing to do with the fruitless deeds of darkness, but rather expose them. For it is shameful even to mention what the disobedient do in secret."

Do our entertainment choices please the Lord? Or do we accept "what the disobedient do in secret" as our entertainment? Garbage in, garbage out. We must ask God to help us to be aware of all the sinful influences on our children, to avoid them, and teach our children to do the same. Be strong enough to say "no". Small influences have a way of becoming strong influences, possibly even putting faith in jeopardy- ours and our children's.

"Finally brothers, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable – if anything is excellent or praiseworthy – think about such things." –Philippians 4:8
